DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND CULTURAL STUDIES

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of English and Cultural Studies is among the premier departments for the Degrees in Masters and Doctorate in the Country. The courses range from Contemporary Literature to Language Studies, from World Literatures to

Contemporary Critical Approaches, Academic Skills, Regional Literatures in Translation, Postcolonial and Cultural Studies. While imparting instruction at the Master's and Under-graduate (B.A./B.Sc Hons.) levels, research work on a large scale in new and challenging areas is conducted by the faculty as well as students. The department organizes curricular and extra-curricular activities: Quiz contests, Seminars, Declamation Contests, Group Discussions, Career-Oriented Workshops (Translation, Creative, Film-making etc. are a part of the curriculum). JRF-UGC Examination Preparation classes are also conducted by the Research Scholars. It also produces its signature annual play production as a part of EUNOIA – annual festival of the Department. In addition, the Department brings out a peer-reviewed, international journal bi-annually, dialog. The faculty includes several distinguished experts from varied specialization who have travelled extensively for academic purposes. It also offers a fully-equipped Library along with reading room facilities for researchers. The students have access to the A.C. Joshi Library, the main library of Panjab University. Its offices are located on the second floor of the Arts Block-I; with its classrooms, seminar room, smart classroom and Mulk Raj Anand Auditorium stretching out on the various levels of the block. The department is a nodal office for the Regional Centre Departments and all the affiliated colleges of the Panjab University. The UGC-Special Assistance Programme (Departmental Research Support-I) had been sanctioned to the Department for 5 years (April 2011 to March 2016). The UGC-Special Assistance Programme (Departmental Research Support-II) has also been awarded to the Department for 2016-21.

English Proficiency Course (EPC) - The aim of the course is to develop a higher degree of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing English. It is suitable both for students wishing to go in for higher education and for those who wish to plan to be employed. Those members of the public who need training in English Proficiency can join the course. Practice in the exercise of all the four skills leading to the proficient and effective use of the language in various situations is the aim of the course. Depending on the time at the disposal of the students, it can be customized for a delivery time of 15-30 session spanning 90 minutes each. In case any student wants to extend the learning across a period for one year, an online module and a learning platform with mentorship is available.

The fee for the course is Rs. 15,000. The course is designed for flexibility as per the trainee profile.

The modules are the following:

Listening Comprehension: The trainees would listen to pieces of spoken English and will be trained to listen for meaning. Constant remedial input and testing would run side-by-side.

Speaking: The instructor will cover the basics of Standard English including suprasegmental like stress, rhythm and intonation. Practice in speaking would run along with instruction.

Reading: The students will be trained in the various strategies of effective reading leading to good comprehension.

Writing: The basic elements of proficient writing will be imparted alongwith extensive practice in writing with remedial feedback. Training in writing for a specific profession is included. The EPC begins with a Diagnostic Test and ends with another Diagnostic Test to assess the level of improvement achieved in each trainee. There is no extra charge for these tests.

THRUST AREAS: The Department concentrates on a wide range of subjects which include: British Literature (Poetry, Prose, Fiction and Drama), American Literature, World Literature, Indian Literatures, Comparative Literature, Postcolonial Studies, Writings from Punjab, Critical Theory, Linguistics, ELT & Communication Skills, Feminism (Theory & Practice), Film & Media, Literature and Ecology, Cultural Studies, New Media Studies, Indian Poetics, Creative and Academic Writing, and Translation Studies.

PLACEMENT: The Placement Cell of the department serves as a crucial bridge between students and potential employers, playing a significant role in shaping students' careers. The cell organizes workshops, seminars, expert lectures, interactions and training programs throughout the academic year. These initiatives provide students with exposure to diverse career opportunities and internships. Each year, several students of the department pursue careers in teaching across schools, colleges, and universities, while a few prepare for competitive examinations for All-India and State-level Civil Services. The department receives recruitment interest from a variety of employers, including organizations like the Indian Air Force, PR agencies such as Quick Relations, leading newspapers like *Hindustan Times*, *The Tribune*, and *The Times of India*, as well as HR firms and placement consultancies. Many students are also recruited by private institutes such as Grey Matters and the British Council. Additionally, a number of students have secured internships and fellowships through platforms like *Internshala*.

ALUMNI RELATIONS: The Department has a strong base and abiding relationship with its alumni. Meetings, blood donation camps and cultural events are organized annually. Yearly scholarships are given to needy students by the alumni.

DEPARTMENT OF FRENCH & FRANCOPHONE STUDIES

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT:

After having shifted to Chandigarh in 1957 the Department of French & Francophone Studies has grown steadily, and is the most vibrant among foreign language departments. It is the only department among Indian universities in the North of Delhi which offers courses of all levels from Certificate to M.A and Ph.D. In an endeavor to keep pace with the changing times, and to participate in economic development, the course contents are revised and new components introduced from time to time. The infrastructure is continuously being upgraded and computers and projectors are also used in classrooms besides other audio-visual aids in foreign language teaching. New books are added every year to the department library 'Bibliothèque Michel Dèon' named after the renowned writer and member of Académie Française, Michel Deon. Many of our alumni have got placement in good multinational companies as well as in universities, colleges and schools in the country. The faculty participates regularly in national and international conferences to present papers and update skills.

Guru Ravi Das Chair for Sant Sahitya Studies is set up to study and research on various aspects of the life, work, philosophy and contribution of mystic poet, thinker and philosopher Guru Ravi Das and other aspects of Bhakti Movement. The bani of Guru Ravi Das not only speaks about the universal brotherhood, tolerance and secularism but also reshapes the Indian Knowledge and religious tradition in terms of evolving the concept of sacred/ *dharma* in terms of establishing equality of all human beings: beyond the caste and gender based hierarchies. It is attributed with a large body of hymns, verses and Shaloks which become part of Sri Guru Granth Sahib.

The Urdu and Persian studies had been the major subjects of teaching in the Oriental College of Lahore in Pakistan, which was later on established in the name of University of Panjab at Lahore in the year 1882, and the eminent Persian & Urdu poet Allama Iqbal Lahori had been the alumni of the Department. The study of said courses were resumed by this University after the partition of India in year 1947 and at the first stage, the University introduced the certificate course in Urdu and Persian and later on the Diploma and Advanced Diploma Courses were also started respectively. In the Year 1991, the Department became the Post Graduate Department where the regular teaching of M.A. in Urdu started, under annual and later on under semester system. M.A. in the subject of Persian for Private Candidates only. The Department has the Ph.D/ Research work in the both subjects i.e. Persian and Urdu. The Department has two separate Literary and Cultural Societies in the name of Bazm-e-Adab Urdu and also Bazm-e-Adab Farsi which organizes the literary and cultural programs with the students of the Department of Urdu & Persian. The Department has its own Departmental Library with a good number of reference and text books in the subjects of Urdu and Persian.
