DEPARTMENT OF LAWS

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Laws, originally established at Lahore in 1889, was re-established at Shimla in 1948, shifted to Jalandhar in 1950 and finally re-located at the University Campus at Chandigarh in 1959. Its Alumni include Judges of the Supreme Court and High Courts, Union Cabinet Ministers, State Chief Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, Ambassadors, Senior Bureaucrats, Police Officers and other legal luminaries. Department of Laws has produced a large number of distinguished alumni who have contributed immensely to the cause of the nation building such as Sushma Swaraj, Justice V.K. Bali, Justice Ashok Bhan and Chief Minister of Punjab Charanjit Singh Channi. The Department provides practical training to LL.B. students. Students of 1st year participated in the project based learning make their presentations students of 2nd year participate in moots. Students of 3rd year undergo their internship with empaneled Lawyers, Judicial Officers of Courts/ Commissions / Tribunals/ Boards etc. for three weeks. Every year the students of the department are sent to the Supreme Court of India as a part of the practical training program. It has established a pro-bono, Constitution Club, Family Law and Alternate Dispute Resolution Centre, Moot Court Society, Debate Society and a Legal Aid Clinic-cum-Arbitration Centre as well as a Placement Cell. The Department has provision for special lectures in memory of Justice Mehr Chand Mahajan and S. Ajit Singh Sarhadi. These lectures have been delivered over the years by eminent persons such as Justice V.K. Krishna Iyer, Justice V.S. Deshpande, Professor Upendra Baskhi, Dr. L.M. Singhvi, Professor Mool Chand Sharma, Justice J.S. Verma, Mr. Soli J. Sorabjee, Prof. M.R. Madhava Menon and Prof. B.S. Chimni, Justice Tirth Singh Thakur, Justice Dinesh Melwani, Prof. Ranbir Singh, Prof. Usha Tandon and Prof. Vijaya Kumar. Library at department of laws provide a blend of services with books, journals, newsletter and e-databases at one place. It has significant number of 47400 books inclusive of age old manuscripts and text books. It provides access to the online data bases of full text judgements of Supreme Court and all the High Courts of India, and e-laws books such as Manupatra, Lexis Advances, Thomson Reuters Proview, Cambridge University Press, Oxford University Press Package and Sage. The Department has also distinction of having Depository Library for United Nations with more than 9000 documents. The Department regularly publishes Panjab University Law Review Journal bi-annually. The Department also issues the volume of its newsletter bi-annually.

Note-3: No candidate will be admitted to the LL.B. course having any Degree inconsistent with the University Grants Commission Regulations and also Bar Council of India, Rules of Legal Education 2008.

Note 4: The concession by way of any additional seat is not applicable to the students falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE. Thus, this concession is also not applicable to the LL.B. course, as this course is regulated by Bar Council of India.

Note 5: Timings for LL.B. classes shall be as per Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008 i.e. 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot court exercise and seminar with half an hour recess.
